Title: Ferry Terminal for Kake

WHEREAS, for the last forty years, the community of Kake has gone without an enclosed ferry terminal, despite the inclement weather that frequents Southeast Alaska, and

WHEREAS, many times, the passengers are our people going out of town for medical attention, including many of our senior citizens, resulting in having to wait outside in these tough weather conditions, and

WHEREAS, because of the lack of a fully-equipped ferry terminal, an office building, etc., there is always a delay in getting the passengers and the traffic aboard, and

WHEREAS, with a terminal, building, and adequate equipment, including an agent, it would eliminate these types of problems and make it much more pleasant and efficient for the passengers, now

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Alaska Native Brotherhood and the Alaska Native Sisterhood in convention in Ketchikan, Alaska on October 3, 2003 adopt this resolution and join in our quest to be included in the next phase of building and rebuilding ferry terminals by the state.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED THAT the executive committee see that this and other similar resolutions be turned over to the next legislative session to make sure it gets the proper attention.
